Dr Andrew Rhodes is a consultant in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine at St George's University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and a Reader at the St George's University of London.

Andrew Rhodes is a Consultant in Intensive Care Medicine and Anaesthesia. He has research interests in the fields of surgery, sepsis, haemodynamics and outcomes related to Peri-operative and Intensive Care Medicine. He is widely published in these areas and is regularly invited to lecture on these subjects all around the World.

Andrew Rhodes trained in Medicine at the St George's, University of London qualifying in 1990. He underwent specialist training in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine and became a consultant at St George's Hospital, London in 1999. He is currently the Chair of the Children's, Women's, Diagnostics, Therapies and Critical Care Division of St George's University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

Andrew has held leadership roles at both a national and an international level. He currently represents the South London Senate to the Adult Critical Care Clinical Reference Group at NHS England. He is a Council member of the Faculty of Intensive Care Medicine (FICM) chairing their Workforce Advisory Group. He is a past president of the European Society of Intensive Care Medicine (ESICM) and a previous secretary of the European Board of Intensive Care Medicine (EBICM) and is the current co-chair of the Surviving Sepsis Campaign.
